a. Brief statement of nominee's qualifications / experience.

Paisan Rangsikitpho has had a lifetime relationship with the Sport of Badminton. After success as a player in his youth and college years, he chose to give back, first as a coach, then as a volunteer. Starting at the local level in the mid 1980's, he assisted with the Southern California Badminton Association, eventually becoming its President. Shortly thereafter, seeking larger responsibilities, he graduated to a role with USA Badminton, founding the USAB court officials committee and founding and chairing the US OPEN as early achievements. Later, he organized one of the most successful BWF World Championships in 2005 in Anaheim, California, and became USAB President soon after. Taking his abilities and experience to the international stage in the mid 1990's, he began working with the Pan American Badminton Confederation, again, quickly founding the organization's court officials committee and serving in various positions since. His role with the BWF began in 1999 as an elected Council Member and has been punctuated by role as BWF Deputy President the past four years. As Paisan's volunteer career at all levels of Badminton has progressed, he has gained valuable insights and experience in nearly all facets of the sport's operations, which have contributed to his many successful decisions and achievements.



b. Badminton experience and involvement.

In addition to what is listed above, He credits his accomplishment to gaining first-hand experience through the years in the functions that he now directs and oversees. In serving as an umpire and referee for many years, he prepared for his work organizing the court officials committees, conducting international Badminton umpire and referee courses, writing the Umpire Training Syllabus, creating the Umpire Score-Sheet, and introducing the 3X21 Rally Points Scoring System used today. In managing increasing larger tournaments over time, and serving as chair of the BWF Events Committee, he was well prepared to launch the Super Series, which has become a very prosperous commercial model for Badminton. Finally, after he served as Chair of many technical committees at many levels, he was fully equipped for his position as Technical Delegate at both the Beijing and London Olympic Games, which are the two most successful Badminton Olympic events in history.

c. Other sporting, commercial, management or professional experience or relevant qualifications.

For the majority of his professional life, Paisan Rangsikitpho was a business owner and operator, with the unique responsibilities, challenges, experiences, and insights that brings. Additionally, Paisan has a matchless understanding of world cultures, having grown up in Asia, being educated in the USA, and then spending a great deal of the past 20 years internationally. Paisan is a problem solver, and believes his team-oriented approachable nature has contributed to his ability to enact major changes over time.

d. Statement on behalf of nominee on how he / she can assist world badminton.

Over the past four years, under the leadership of Dr. Kang and Paisan, the BWF and the Sport of Badminton have made tremendous progress. The professionalism and ability they have brought to the organization have led to excellent governance, financial stability, a successful Super Series, and a strong relationship with the IOC that has kept Badminton as a sport in the Olympic Games. Overall, we have seen larger media and commercial agreements and more prize money, which have in turn led to more opportunities for players and a better experience for the fans. Badminton has been the fastest growing sport in the world, by far. None of this, however, can be taken for granted.

To continue to move Badminton in the right direction, and to ascend to new levels, the BWF must continue to have strong and experienced leadership. Paisan has vast and unmatched experience



at all levels of world Badminton. Under his administration he will continue to support commercially driven BWF events, including the Super Series, the Grand Prix Gold Series, and others to be created. He aims to leverage the success of the past four years towards forming new relationships and expanding into new opportunities. In his term he will carry on the strong and long-lasting relationships with the Continental Confederations and move to build upon the backing the BWF brings each group. In sum, he is committed to doing everything in his power to help take Badminton to the economic level of all other world sports, where it belongs.

On top of elevating the sport's economics, he is dedicated to extending the opportunities created by the improved economics to all interests, especially to those in most need of BWF support. He is passionate about making sure the BWF has the ability to do more, and intends to boost funding towards providing extra training and equipment to the emerging programs of developing countries, to building upon the support given to Para-Badminton, and to promote women's roles in Badminton.
